Seldom do we find a British sportsman winning international honours at both athletics and Rugby football. Only the late Eric Liddell, of Scotland, Jock Butler (Poly, Harriers and Harlequins) and, quite recently, Cyril Holmes, of Manchester, have pulled off the double distinction.

If the double distinction. If J. C. M. Wilkinson's Rugger form is anything like the standard of his sprinting shown in the Public Schools 100 yards championship at Motspur Park then he should be booked to emulate their feat (writes Roy Moor).

I am told that this Uppingham boy holds a first love for Rugby, vet he completely outclassed all opposition in Saturday's short sprint final to win by three yards in 10.3sec., 1-10th outside record. Tall and well built, Wilkinson gets quickly into his running from the holes and moves with delightful ease.

Another notable performer was J. Banes (Eosom), who put the 121b. shot 48ft. 3in., an improvement of 24in. on the record set by H. Merz (Germany) in 1936.

A RECORD - BREAKING high jump of 6ft. by 17-year-old P. Wells, of Queen Elizabeth's, Barnet, outshone all else on the opening day of the Public Schools athletic championships at Motspur Park Previous best high-jump at these Games was the 5ft. 10kin. by H. A. Simmons in 1928. When it is recalled that internationals Stan West and John Newman did not attain even this height in winning the Public Schools title, Wells's performance is certainly one of which to be proud.

His record leap, in above his own height, actually cleared the bar with lim. to spare, but feeling tired, he wisely called a halt at 6ft. An exceptional spring is the secret of Wells's success, and he might easily find another 6in, when he perfects the Western roll technique.

Double for Dodd

B. W. Dodd (St. Albans) received a shock before retaining the javelin championship with 174ft. Tain. Using a metal javelin, J. Swaisland (Bishophalt) got in a beautiful throw of 184ft, but because the implement had not been approved in advance of the competition. his throw was not allowed to count Dodd also won the discus at 127ft. Olin.
