## NEWS LETTER No. 7.

DEAR OLD ELIZABETHANS,

For the benefit of those O.E.s who do not receive a copy of "The Elizabethan" we start this letter with a short summary of School news. The School 1st XV won 6, drew 2, and lost 5; the 2nd XV won 1, drew 1, and lost 7; the 3rd XV won 3, lost 4; the Colts XV won 4, drew 1, and lost 4; during the season 1943-44. In a triangular athletics match against Bedford Modern and Owen's Schools, the School gained 81 points, Bedford Modern 60, and Owen's 27. In House events, Stapylton beat Underne 6-3 in the final of the Senior "Rugger"; whilst in the Junior final Stapylton beat Broughton 12-3. At Athletics, Underne gained all the honours, winning the Steeplechase with 44 points (Places 1, 4, 5, 10, 11, and 13) against Stapylton 59, Leicester 98, and Broughton 122; the Relays with 26 points (S. 25, L. 19, B. 14); and the Athletics Cup, obtaining 160 points, with Stapylton runner-up with 133½ (B. 115½, L. 109). The Chess Cup went also to Underne by half-a-point (U. 14, S. 13½, B. 11½, L. 9).

The O.E.s have not been idle in the field of sport, the "Rugger" club enjoying another somewhat haphazard season, yet managing to play some 24 games, with the results shown below. ## NOTES AND NEWS FROM OLD ELIZABETHANS IN THE FORCES.

A chronological survey of O.E. news would not be complete without acknowledging the Christmas and New Year greetings received both by the School, Headmaster, Masters, and the Forces Committee from many parts of the world; so, many thanks, and here's the hope that via "The Elizabethan" or the "News Letter" you have all by now received ours in reciprocation. Pte. A. A. Smith (1927-33) R.A.S.C., breaks a four years' silence with a rather brilliant opening idea, i.e. that the Notes and News shall be a peacetime link within the O.E. Association, as well as a war-time expedient (what think ye!), before recounting his service career in four phases: one, via billets in the Exchange Buildings at Brussels to the beaches and "epic of Dunkirk"; two, a leisured life at a university city of England; three, to Syracuse and Sicily, with tales of the catacombs and the Greek amphitheatres; four, en route for Berlin, via censored! Lt. F. L. Carter (1927-31) R.N.V.R., in bed following a mild attack of jaundice, tells of a presentation of a fairly useful second row forward for the 1958 scrum in his son David! and then of travels to Spain to see his first, and he hopes, his last, bull fight: of invading Sicily clad in swimming trunks, life belt, and tin-hat (much more comfortable than service kit!): of resting at Capri after invading Salerno (with others!), and vowed to go there to spend his last days in perfect peace (at Capri, we imagine!). Gunner-Cadet R. C. Marlow (1933-43) R.A., in training, played rugger with F. E. Arnold, an old "enemy" from St. Albans School, and Oakley, the captain of Bedford, and right centre recently for the Army v. R.A.F.: and is billeted in some old mills, which before the war, manufactured blankets. "They," he writes; the mills, not the blankets (Army!); "are very extensive and . . . most comfortable!" 2nd-Lieut V. A. M. McLeod (1934-37) R.A., after spending months attempting to learn copious notes, and at the same time polish and maintain white webbing and shining breeches, whilst bringing the foot down in drill like the thunder of a blacksmith's hammer," says "Much was the crawling among thorns in crafty infantry schemes, and the marching here and the marching there," but now "with a weight off his shoulders and an added one! his pronunciation of 'eck-tually' is coming along nicely!" He met Captain J. V. Skinner (1932-38) R.A., by chance, and they "nattered" happily to catch up on six years' separation from one another, at the same time completely blocking the one and only entry to an important location in the cloakroom! Skinner, in another letter, asks us did he see Gunner K. A. Howard (1931-36) R.A., in the M.E. on a train? At a guess, yes; but it's a little difficult to see that far! Cadet K. R. A. Toms (1934-39) R.A.F., sends us an airgraph to record a remarkable coincidence. "At the time of writing there are at this camp, some thousands of miles from Barnet, four O.E.s. This is, in itself, rather amazing. But even more amazing is the fact that they started their school career on the same day, September 20th 1934, in the same form, 2A." The O.E.s were Sergt. J. S. Kiff (1934-39) R.A.F.; Cadet K. J. McGreal (1934-39) R.A.F.; and Cadet T. H. Widgery (1934-37) R.A.F. (It's truth . . . and thus stranger than fiction!) Sergt. L. J. Harding (1934-39) R.A.F., instructing in Southern Rhodesia, records seeing Sergt. W. D. Hallett (1934-40) through as 'N-B-W.' and continues to prevent the younger generation from breaking up 'planes or himself, not being sure which is their most fixed intention. Lieut. F. G. R. Gear (1930-34) R.W.A.F.F., travelling to a land flowing with tea and dehydrated potatoes, the former on sale from Char Wallahs at 3 annas a cup, and the latter given away by the Q.M. with a wholesome tin of bully (three guesses, all correct!), via a town boasting the sale of genuine Carlsberg Pilsener lager and Charles Heidsieck fizz (three guesses, all wrong! ), to Ijebu-dye (we give up!!), with its European civilization of a swimming bath, fourteen white persons, four ladies, who cooked each Sunday a thirty dish 'curry,' and a civilian doctor, by another coincidence, Dale, an O.E. (1895-1903); now finds himself ranged with his Ghurkas against the Japs, whence a tale: "A Ghurka with his razor-sharp Kukri met a Jap face to face. The Jap made the first lunge with his bayonet, and the Ghurka stepping nimbly aside said 'Aha! missed,' and gave a stroke with his Kukri, whereupon the Jap stepped aside and also said 'Aha! missed.' The Ghurka then smiled and said 'Oh, yes! Wait until you turn your head!'" (If you know your Ghurka, it's tricky!) Sub-Lieut. R. T. Baker (1934-40) R.N.V.R., from Malta, extends an invitation to any "calling in" to see him, and as he is apparently now attached to the Naval Accommodation Officer, it sounds a good idea! He records doubtful rugger on the island's one pitch, well studded with rocks; and a delightful time at Christmas and the New Year, sampling the local brew, and forgetting that any air raids ever happened at Malta, G.C. L/Cpl. W. J. Gunn (1924-31) City of London Yeomanry, visited the School on leave (Erigel!), looking fit and bronzed, on long leave from W. Africa, having had a "front seat" in the "whole show" since Wavell's first advance, but has not met any O.E.s personally, except via letter or intermediaries. Cadet B. F. Edwards (1935-42) R.A.F., records his Christmas spent being entertained with typical Canadian hospitality at Winnipeg, a slight hesitancy in air plotting (still!): but enjoys flying: and hopes for the best! L/Cpl. E. P. Bull (1935-42) Royal Fusiliers, in the depths of Scotland, with the nearest railway station forty miles away, has ploughed some goodly furrows in the snow with his shoulder playing rugger, after toughening up with "Purposeful P.T." (a new army invention!). He sends greetings, and passes on the course motto "Bash on!" (which reminds us of another R.A.F. station motto: "Nil iligit carbonundum," translated so we are told, by the Classical VIII: "Don't let the blighters grind you down"). Leading Naval Airman P. F. Walpole (1934-43) R.N.V.R., is stationed in the neighbourhood of Lake Huron, and has visited Detroit on leave, where hospitality was again very much in evidence, so much so that it was nearly an offence to offer money for food or drinks; he hopes to pass out in April, or thereabouts. F/Lieut. F. C. G. Sheward (1918-24) R.A.F., writes from Reykjavik, stating his rank as above, suggested that "?" and "L.A.C." could be "subtle flattery" or "—" in previous O.E. lists, and says: "Should any O.E.s have the good fortune (?) to be posted to Iceland, I should very much appreciate a visit. Obviously, any who may come here would have scarcely started life when I left school, but we'll have something in common." (Very fair!)

The above seems to have filled the space left the News Letter, due to the publication of the O.E. lists in full, so hoping this taste of news will stir your "scribal" instincts to action, for "Writing makes an exact man!" (Shades of School Cert. context!) and a fuller and better News Letter, and like Oliver Twist we always "ask for more."
