UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIPS

OPEN SCHOLARSHIPS or Exhibitions were won by P. J. RHODES in Classics at Wadham College, Oxford; M. A. SABIN, the Vickers Scholarship at Trinity Hall, Cambridge; M. J. TOMKINSON in Modern Languages at the Queen's College, Oxford; R. PECK, the Livenside Scholarship in Chemistry at Imperial College; and M. A. SPENCE in English at Exeter College, Oxford.

STATE SCHOLARSHIPS were won by E. N. ARNOLD (at St. Peter's Hall, Oxford) and J. D. REES (at Birmingham University), and P. W. A. LEVER was on the reserved list for these awards.

OXFORD UNIVERSITY GENERAL CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION

In addition, thirty-five boys passed one or two papers at Advanced Level, and one hundred and twenty-six other boys passed papers at Ordinary Level. The overall percentage of passes at all levels in papers taken was 91 per cent.

TRACK AND FIELD ATHLETICS

The First Athletic Team won five matches and lost two; the Junior Teams won four matches and lost two. W. S. Brown represented the London Schools against the Northern Schools, and he, K. Henderson, A. A. May, P. Cooke and T. O. R. J. Herbert between them won eight Herts County Schools, Youths or Junior Championships.

SWIMMING

The First Team won one match and lost two. The Royal Life Saving Society's Examiners awarded two Instructor's Certificates, six Awards of Merit, five Bronze Crosses and eighteen Bronze Medallions.

FIVES

The First VI won one match and lost two; and the School pairs reached the third round of the Public Schools' Eton Fives Championships.

The CHESS CLUB'S First Team won twenty-seven matches to five lost, with two drawn; Junior Teams won thirteen matches and lost five. The School took third place out of 247 entrants in the Schools' National Chess Tournament, and won the Hertfordshire Schools' Senior Trophy, Junior Trophy and the Finchley Chess Club's Schools' Shield. A. P. de M. Logsdon, D. E. Guy and N. J. E. Reynolds tied for the Hertfordshire Boys' Championship, the first named ultimately winning it.
