SWIMMING RULES.

1. KIT.

- (a) Boys who are "Learners" will wear red slippers until they pass out of the learner stage. To save expense these will be hired at 3d. per term from Mr. Slater and will remain the school property.
- (b) Boys not learners will wear blue trunks. The standard pattern can be obtained at the School Outfitters for 3/11 or 4/6 according to size. It is obviously desirable that boys should wear the same kit, but this will not be compulsory to boys who already have costumes, provided these costumes are dark blue.
- (c) Each boy must have a mackintosh bag (e.g. a sponge bag) in which to keep wet bathing kit.

2. LEARNERS.

A boy is a Learner until officially passed out by the Coordination Master or the Physical Education Master and posted on the Board as having passed a test fixed by them.

3. GENERAL USE OF THE BATH.

- (a) All boys should visit the Lavatory before changing.
- (b) All boys must go through the footbath before entering the main bath.
- (c) Boys shall take off their shoes before going on the concrete surround and, having done so, shall not go off the concrete on to the grass.
- (d) No boy shall push any boy into the Bath or in any way play the fool in the water.
- (e) At a series of blasts from a whistle, all boys shall go to the side of the Bath and remain there in absolute quiet.
- (f) Learners must keep to the shallow end of the Bath.

4. PRIVATE PARTIES.

A private party is a group of boys using the Bath outside a teaching party. This is only permissible if

- (a) A Master or full School Prefect is present
- (b) A Lifeguard (Certified Life Saver) is also present, CHANGED, but not in the water.

5. Swimming Competitions will be upon conditions determined from time to time by the Games Club, and tests for Swimming Certificates, ^{will be} as determined by the Coordination and Physical Education Masters.
