The Procession will be representative of Military, Civic, Ecclesiastical and Social Organizations in the Town, with Decorated or otherwise Agricultural and other Vehicles.

Three Prizes of £4, £2, and £1 each, will be given for the Best Decorated Vehicles, and Three Prizes of £7, £4, and £2 each for the Best Decorated Houses or Shops in High Street on the morning of July 19th. Three Prizes of £2, £1, and 10s. each will be specially awarded to the Agricultural Section.

On the return of the Procession to Hadley Green, competitors for prizes in sections one and three will be assembled by the Marshals until the judging is completed.
