TRACK AND FIELD ATHLETICS

The School First Athletic Team won three matches, lost four and drew one; the lower teams won all their six matches. The Cross-Country team took part in five open races, always being well placed, and was second in the Herts Schools' Race.

SWIMMING. The Royal Life Saving Society's Examiners made the following awards: Five Awards of Merit, three Instructor's Certificates, five bronze crosses, and twelve Bronze Medallions.

THE CHESS CLUB First Team won thirteen matches and lost five; the lower teams lost only one of ten matches. It won the Herts Chess Association Inter-School Trophy, and Junior Inter-School Trophy, and the Herts Junior Chess Congress Team Trophy; and it also provided the winner of the Hertfordshire Boys' Championship.
