ATHLETIC SPORTS, 1891.

"Rennyng is bothe a good exercise and a laudable solace," wrote Sir Thomas Elyot, an eminent physician of the reign of Henry VIII., and Barnet of to-day seems quite of this opinion, for on Saturday, April 18th, a very large crowd of visitors assembled at the field to see the School "inforce themselves with strengthe and agilitie" in those exercises "whereby shulde growe both recreation and profite." The entries were quite up to, if not rather above the average, and many of the events were most closely contested. C. G. Owen cut the School records for the quarter and long jump, the latter event being quite the most excellent on the programme, as all three competitors beat the previous School jump. The Games' Committee wish to express their sincere thanks to those friends of the School who sent prizes or donations. The band of the 7th King's Royal Rifles, under the direction of Mr. S. Barritt, added much to the success of the gathering. On another page we have inserted a list of the open events and winners since the institution of the athletics. In estimating the value of these it must be remembered that ours is a grass course of five laps to the mile.

Long Jump; open (3 entries).—1st, C. G. Owen, 17ft. 5in.; 2nd, V. Simons, 17ft. 3in. This was a very good performance, all three competitors clearing 17ft. 2in., the previous school record. Owen afterwards jumped 17ft. 8in. Simons' other jumps were 15ft. 11in., and 16ft. 9in.

Quarter Mile; second division (3 entries).—A disappointing race; there should have been at least ten entries. 1st, L. H. Lovegrove. Time, 73secs. Only two started, Lovegrove led the whole way and finished alone, Woods giving up at the pavilion.

Quarter Mile; open (5 entries).—1st, C. G. Owen; 2nd, S. H. Adams. Time, 63secs. Wright went off with the lead. When rounding the first corner the order was, Wright, Adams, Owen. On passing the pond Adams took the lead, but was passed soon on entering the straight by Owen. A good struggle for premier honours resulted in favour of Owen by 2yds.; 5yds. between 2nd and 3rd.
